Workbench tips and tricks by Linda Keays

Oxide, friend or foe?

When soldering most of the metals used in Jewellery making, most people will know that oxide, that thin coating which develops on metal surfaces exposed to the oxygen in the air, is something which will prevent solder flowing into a join. Therefore most people will have been given good advice about how joints to be soldered must be very tight-fitting, (even spring-fitted when possible, as in rings), and immaculately clean, with the metal scraped or filed to a bright finish and immediately painted with flux (commonly borax), to prevent accelerated oxide formation during heating.

However, this tendency to stop solder flowing can be used to advantage. Here is a situation when the jeweller definitely does NOT want solder to flow. The roller catch for brooches is very vulnerable to unwanted solder flowing up into the roller mechanism, but this trick will stop it happening. Pre-heat the roller catch gently, (hot, but not enough to melt it), with a soft flame before using it. If it is Sterling, 925 silver, it will darken noticeably as a film of oxide forms. All that needs to be done is to let it cool, sand the part which will be attached to the brooch to a bright finish, coat this part ONLY with flux, place in position on the brooch, where you will have created a clean, level, fluxed place for it, place small pieces of fluxed "easy' grade solder around it, and heat the brooch rather than the catch. Job done!

Remember, oxide as a 'solder stop' can be cleaner and easier to use than painting a thick paste of yellow ochre watercolour paint onto areas where you don't want solder to flow. It is possible to have solder run just as far as a pre-determined line, with a bit of careful planning.

Field trip Ethics

- You must have a Current Victoria Miner's Right.
- Before entering private property, be it grazing, farming, mining, quarrying etc, permission must be obtained from the owner, lessee, manager or other responsible person, for prospecting, mining, collecting gemstones or camping.
- When permission has been obtained, members will obey any direction, restriction, order, advice or precaution given by the person in charge of the property.
- Ensure that gates of properties are left as found, shut or open.
- Stock, including domestic animals, are not to be interfered with under any circumstances.
- Firearms and explosives shall not be taken on field trips.
- Do not take pets on field trips.
- Leave an area as you find it. Fill in all holes and remove all litter. Be sure that gutters and drains are clear.
- Do not dig in banks of streams.
- Do not dig in or foul streams
 which are part of a water catch-

ment area.

- Do not damage or undermine trees or other vegetation.
- Keep off crops and tilled land unless permission is granted.
 Use furrows to walk in if you must traverse tilled land.
- Do not remove excessive amounts of material. Take only enough for your personal use, not for commercial purposes.
- Extinguish all fires by covering them with soil. Don't chop trees to make your fire
- Use fallen and broken limbs. Do not light fires when restrictions are in force, including TOTAL FIRE BAN DAYS.


A reminder that if you would like to fossick a "Miners Right" is required.

A Miner's Right allows the holder to search for, and take possession of, any mineral located on many areas of public land, or, on private land with the landholder's prior consent. Only basic non-powered hand tools (i.e. pick, shovel, sieve, etc.) can be used. This can be purchased online at https://
